Activity: Write a letter about how you've lived our school vision

We believe that everyone is precious and loved by God. We aspire to let our light shine in all that we do. We nurture and empower one another to flourish.

Together we shine in our world by showing compassion and by serving others. Let God's light shine through us.

Write a letter to a friend or close family member and teach them about our school vision and what it means. This is not only a great way to stay in contact with loved ones but a lovely chance to talk about how you are shining your light out of school. This may be a traditional letter or it could even be an email.

This could be anything form helping around the house to taking charge of your own learning.





Activity: Salt dough Easter ornaments

To make the salt dough ornaments, you need to mix together 1 cup of <u>salt</u> and 1 cup of <u>flour</u>. Give it a good mix together to combine the salt and flour.

Add 1/2 cup – 1 cup of <u>water</u> (slowly) to the dry ingredients and carefully mix. The mixture will seem quite wet at first but continue to mix it. You can also roll it out onto a floured table top and knead it.

Roll your dough out with a rolling pin (5mm thickness) and cut your Easter shapes out (with an adult).

Place them on a lined baking tray and bake on a very low heat (approx. gas mark 1) for about 2.5 hours then decorate!
