Activities for the week beginning 27th April 2020

Hello all,

I hope that you enjoyed last week's activities. We will be continuing with our learning around the theme of 'Great Explorers'.

English activities: This week we will be continuing to use our imaginations.



Imagine that you are an astronaut. You have just taken off from Earth, in your rocket and have entered space. How are you feeling? What can you see? Where do you want to go?

Easy: write 3 descriptive sentences about what you can see. Try to include at least 3 examples of adjectives.

Medium: imagine that you have discovered a new planet. Draw a picture of this planet and then come up with an advert/poster that is telling people from Earth all about your newly discovered planet.

Hard: write a letter home, from the viewpoint of yourself as an astronaut in space. Make sure to include descriptions of what you can see, what you're getting up to and how you are feeling.

Challenge:

- 1. Use expanded noun phrases, e.g. **bright**, **beautiful** stars
- 2. Use a range of conjunctions: **so, because, and, or, that, when.** For example: The bright, orange sun shone through the window **so** I got up to lower the blinds.

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


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Maths activities: We will be learning about position and directions this week but make sure that you continue to check mathletics each week and also practice your times tables.







If the turn is in the same direction as the hands of a clock, it is **clockwise**.


If the turn is in the opposite direction to the hands of a clock, it is **anticlockwise**.

Starter for everyone: using a partner...

- 1. Give them directions for moving, relating to turns, for example 'take one quarter turn clockwise.
- 2. Now ask them to give your directions that you have to follow.

Easy:

Describe the route Dennis takes to school.



Medium:

Spot the mistake in each pattern. Explain why they are incorrect.



Hard: sit on your sofa. Write directions from your sofa seat to your front door, making sure that they are as accurate as possible, for example 'Stand up and make a quarter turn clockwise'.
